Well we had a holiday weekend for the record books! We manage to dodge the worst of the weather predicted and It was a great seeing all the activity going on in the park and families enjoying some much deserved quality time.

I want to thank all of you that attended the weekend events, by the size of the crowds I can safely say they were a resounding success. Special thanks to the participants in our first ever lip sync battle. What a fun and entertaining night it was as some of the acts certainly “kicked it up notch” on the stage. The concert on the beach was a good one and all who attended seemed to have a blast. It was a great way to send out May and June promises to be just as fun. **Don't miss the Lip Sync Battle on June 22nd as it will be packed with our very own Housekeeping staff as well as the General Manager/Activity Center performances that will be for fun only. BE THERE !!**

Our Activities Center is one of my main focuses this season as it is vital to our campground as a whole and to attract and keep campers interested what Treasure Beach has to offer them to be a seasonal guest here in the park. We have started this revamp with a seasonal guest of our own, the new coordinator Sandy Toler as leading this passion with her daughter Sara, my daughter Callie and stepson Noah as part of the team. Please introduce yourself to them as early in the season as possible as they will be very interactive with the ongoing events. I am confident this team will blow us away with the Activities they have planned for this 2018 season. As a seasonal camper here please make the daily campers feel welcomed and interact with them and encourage them to attend the events that are planned. Who knows they may be your potential neighbor as the newest seasonal camper !

On that subject, if you have not downloaded the activities calendar from our website, please do so. Our events only work if the campers attend and the calendar will make sure everybody is up to speed. It is vital if you want TB to continue the Activities we have planned it must be well attended as I have my staff reporting statistics on each event for review at the end of the season. If you are not able to download the calendar, the office staff will be happy to provide you a copy.

The fun of the weekend aside, the large crowds did expose some issues that need to be addressed:

- The office fielded it's fair share of reports of younger persons operating golf carts in a less than safe manner. Perhaps this is a good time to review the rules on younger drivers and golf carts.
- Young persons of **at least 16 years of age** and possessing a state issued drivers license may operate a **privately owned a golf cart** without a parent. Young persons between the ages of 12-15 years may drive a golf art if a licensed parent, guardian or relative of 21yrs and older is in the passenger seat and has the ability to have control of the cart. **Young persons under 12 yrs of age may not drive a privately owned golf cart.**
- **Rental Golf Carts:** **May only be operated by licensed adults 21 years or older who are listed on the rental agreement.**
- The number of riders on a golf cart may not exceed the number of seats and standing is not permitted.
- Driving recklessly and failing to obey traffic rules will not be tolerated. We are a private campground and we reserve the right to suspend or restrict the use of any cart being operated in an unsafe manner. Let's ensure that we avoid needing to do that.
- Some of the issues with the golf carts has been caused by some of our daily campers and rest assured we are putting new procedures in place to hopefully address and correct the situation.
- The staff also reported many cars full of “young people”, checks of a few of the sights showed that not all occupants of the vehicle were registered and had paid the required guest fees.
- During this graduation season, we invite young people to come and enjoy all that Treasure Beach has to offer. It's a fun safe environment for graduating “seniors” and we want them to feel welcome. But in fairness to all those campers who do the right thing and abide by the rules, we must insist that dependents on a site or guests must register at the office and pay any applicable fees. Seasonal campers please ensure that the younger folks know the rules. This will be a point of emphasis this summer as it has become a hot button issue with the ownership. \$10 a night is an extremely reasonable amount to pay to be able to enjoy all the park has to offer. If you are found to be purposely avoiding this required fee by any means could be cause of loss of your seasonal guest status. It's that serious.

FROM THE GENERAL MANAGER Cont...

- Adult campers, it is important that we brief the kids on bike safety. My staff witnessed an incident where a young bike rider drove into the side of a moving car. Everybody was ok but it could have turned out much worse. Bike riders must obey the traffic signs in the same way as a vehicle. Younger riders should be wearing helmets and all riders should have lights on their bike when riding at night. Let's work on it. One incident resulting in injury is one too many.
- The last issue is one of grave concern to me. I am not sure if it was the "mini" heat wave or the full moon but there were two separate incidents that involved seasonal campers displaying completely inappropriate behavior towards the staff at the office. Let me be as clear as possible, that type of nonsense ends now. If you are the type of person who feels that the payment of your fees entitles you to act or speak anyway you choose to the staff of the park, you are terribly mistaken. This is an issue taken very serious as my staff is an extension of myself.
- We are a camping community and we will all abide by the common rules of respect and courtesy. The staff does not create the rules and policies, they merely enforce them. If some policy causes you some minor inconvenience or irritation, deal with it. Aggressive behavior, confrontations and verbal abuse especially with inappropriate language is not tolerated.
- Our ownership has invested too much money, and senior management has invested too much sweat and effort, into transforming and modernizing our park into a fun and safe place for families to enjoy their leisure time.
- I will not allow a handful of malcontents, agitators and bullies to hijack the process. Those people whose only talent is to complain and denigrate are no longer welcome.
- Reasonable people can disagree and legitimate grievances will occur that should, and will, be addressed by management. These issues **WILL** be presented in a civil manner and in a civil tone. I promise my staff will respond in kind. Reasonable accommodations will be made for special circumstances that warrant it. If a member of my staff treats a camper in a disrespectful way, the camper should immediately report that to me or one of my supervisors so it can be investigated and dealt with in an appropriate manner.
- Luckily, our seasonal camping business has increased to such a degree , that those who do not wish to conform to a standard of civility should be forewarned. If a member of my staff asks you to calm down or take it down a notch, you had better do so. There will be no more warnings, second chances, or hollow apologies accepted. If you verbally abuse, act aggressive or confrontational towards an employee of the park, know this. Your camping reservation will be cancelled, monies returned, site forfeited and RV evicted, immediately. No questions.
- I am sorry to have to waste so much oxygen on the unreasonable actions of a few, but from what I have witnessed this season, a line has been crossed and I fear only something this stern can correct the issue. Moving on to more pleasant issues...

The progress on the new bathhouse and the new sites behind the activity center has been increasing and, if the weather holds out, we should be concluding most of our construction by mid-July. Your understanding and tolerance regarding the work has been great and hopefully we will all be rewarded for our patience soon.

May was a great month. Special thanks to Sandra Toler and all the hard working employees of the activity staff. Their enthusiasm has been rewarded with increased camper participation and I think we can all agree that the improvements have been noticeable. I wish all of our campers a happy, relaxing and enjoyable June. All the fathers out there, please enjoy the holiday and the company of your loved ones.



- 1 tablespoon paprika
- 1/2 teaspoon chili powder
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper
- 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1/2 teaspoon onion powder
